

Family Camp FAQ

Cost

1. What is the cost of Family Camp?
 - a. Each member of your family that is above the age of 1 year, will be charged a fee of \$110. This will cover your cost of meals, lodging, and supplies, for 3 days/2 nights.

Registration

1. When Can I register?
 - a. You may register anytime between now and 10 days prior to the camp you wish to attend. We recommend registering as soon as possible to reserve your spot, as cabins are limited. We also need as much time as possible to prepare for your arrival.

Meals

- a. Will we all be eating together as a group?
 - i. You will eat together as a family unit and have adequate distance between your family and others. Mealtimes may be staggered to accomplish this as well.
- b. Where will we be eating?
 - i. In the dining hall, outside, depending upon the meal
- c. What if a family member has special dietary restrictions?
 - i. Our sites offer gluten-free, vegetarian, nut-free, sugar- and dairy free options. Please indicate any of these needs during your registration.

Medications

- d. Who will be in charge of medications?
 - i. The head of family will be responsible for distributing and safekeeping of medications
- e. What if there is a first aid issue?
 - i. Limited supplies on-site will be available. We encourage each family to bring their own first aid kit or supplies.
- f. Will there be a camp nurse on site this year?
 - i. No.

Lodging

- g. Where will we stay?
 - i. Each family will have their own cabin with twin size beds
- h. What will we need to bring for linens?
 - i. You will need to bring twin-sized sheets or a sleeping bag, pillows and towels

Safety

- i. How close will we be to other campers?
 - i. We encourage all participants to maintain social distance guidelines, currently recommended at 6 feet.
- j. Are masks mandatory?
 - i. When receiving meals and/or when in close proximity with staff or program leaders, masks should be worn.
- k. Are masks provided for campers?
 - i. **No. Masks are required, and each family and camper is responsible for providing their own masks.** We encourage creativity!

Sanitation

- l. What steps are OK Camps' Sites taking to ensure proper disinfection and cleanliness?
 - i. OK Camps utilize best practices and effective products to disinfect areas and objects before, during and after your participation. This includes activity areas, dining areas and facilities.

Activities

- m. What kinds of activities will be available?
 - i. Hiking, water and pool time, worship, nightly campfires, family-themed games, archery, site-specific opportunities (Creek walk at Egan), crafts, Family Devotion, Scavenger Hunt,
- n. Will snacks and items be available in the Canteen?
 - i. YES! We want you to have plenty of opportunities for belly-filling treats and cool stuff!
- o. How do we participate in activities?
 - i. You will participate as a family unit. Your family will sign up for daily activities.
- p. Are there activities we may observe with more than just our family?

- i. Most likely yes. Meal and worship/campfire times may be done as a total group, observing adequate distancing. Also activities such as trivia or scavenger hunts may be “family team” based.\
- q. Will there be a lifeguard on site?
 - i. There may or may not be a lifeguard on site for each swim time. You will be responsible for the supervision of your children at the pool and/or Lake.

Schedule

- r. What time is check in?
 - i. Check in will be 2pm
- s. Can we arrive earlier than 2pm?
 - i. YES! Please enjoy the grounds, but cabins aren't available until 2pm.
- t. What's a typical schedule?
 - i. Day 1- 2 p.m.: Check In
3 -5:30: Free time/Activity sign-ups
5:30: Dinner
8 p.m.: Campfire/ Worship
 - Day 2- 8 a.m.: Breakfast
9-12: Free Time/ Activity sign-ups
Noon: Lunch
1-5:30: Free time/Activity sign-ups
8 p.m.: Campfire/Worship
 - Day 3 8 a.m.: Breakfast
9 a.m.: Clean-up
10 a.m.: Closing gathering/ Worship
