



Hello to our amazing camp volunteers and parents,

Safety is our #1 concern when it comes to conducting camps this summer, so we thought it would be helpful to you to understand how we think about and implement a safe camp experience. We think about safety in terms of “**layers of protection**,” which, taken together, minimize the risks associated with Covid-19. Layers of Protection for our camps in 2021 include:

- **Pre-camp screening** – All people coming to camp will be asked to complete a health screening form before camp to ensure that everyone who comes to camp is healthy.
- **Temperature checks** – The check-in process this year will include a temperature check for all campers and leaders.
- **Vaccinations** – We are encouraging all paid and volunteer staff to be vaccinated prior to camp.
- **Cohort model** – Cohorts, based on smaller groups, will participate in all activities together.
- **Daily cabin cleanups** – Campers and leaders will clean and disinfect cabins daily.
- **Social distancing** – All individuals are encouraged to social distance at all times.
- **Masks** – Mask should be worn whenever possible and social distancing will be used when masks are not worn.
- **Hand washing and sanitizer use** – Leaders will encourage hand washing as often as possible.
- **Nurse review** – A nurse will review all pre-camp screenings and camper health records.
- **Dining Hall** – Staggered meal times and space for distancing will be enacted at meal times.
- **Maximizing outside activities** – As often as possible, campers will be outside to allow for airflow and distancing.
- **Cabins** – Sleeping will be in staggered positions and head-to-toe positioning.
- **Protocols for sick camper** – Standardized procedures for handling campers showing symptoms.
- **Cleaning protocols** – Activity items and areas will be routinely cleaned throughout the day.
- **Worship** – Masks will continue to be worn during worship and cohorts will distance.
- **Staff cleaning procedures** – Staff will follow CDC guidelines for cleaning and disinfecting.
- **Staff safety procedures** – Staff will follow CDC guidelines for procedures related to masks, distancing, etc.

We’re intent on minimizing the risks, while trying to ensure that your children have a fun and safe experience this summer. We continue to monitor guidance from the CDC, State of Oklahoma, American Camp Association, and Association of Camp Nurses.
